Measure definition

Members with a diagnosis of type 1 or type 2 diabetes who had a retinal eye exam performed during measurement year **or** a negative retinal eye exam year prior

This includes of the following:

- A retinal or dilated eye exam by an eye care professional (optometrist or ophthalmologist) in measurement year
- A negative retinal or dilated eye exam (negative for retinopathy) by an eye care professional in year prior to the measurement year



Medical record requirements

- · Member legal name and date of birth
- Provider/practice identifier
- Provider Business Group (PBG) name and number
- Date of service (DOS)
- Applicable lab/test results and date collected

EED has been removed from the hybrid data collection method



Commonly used claim codes*

Any of the following:

- Diabetes mellitus without complications: E10.9
- Eye exam with retinopathy: 2022F, 2024F, 2026F
- Eye exam without retinopathy: 2023F, 2025F, 2033F
- Retinal imaging: 92227, 92228

Exclusions:

Unilateral eye enucleation: 65091, 65093, 65101,
 65110 (2 DOS or bilateral modifier included)

Medical record submission methods may not be applicable to all plan types. For more details, you can reach out to your HEDIS plan representative.

Required exclusions (Other exclusions may also apply)

- Bilateral eye enucleation **or** bilateral absence of eyes any time during the member's history through December 31 of the measurement year
- Members who have died during the measurement year
- Members in hospice or using hospice services during the measurement year
- Members receiving palliative care anytime during the measurement year
- Members who had an encounter for palliative care anytime during the measurement year



- Medicare members 66 years of age and older as of December 31 of the measurement year who
 meet either of the following:
 - Enrolled in an institutional SNP (I-SNP) anytime during the measurement year
 - Living long-term in an institution anytime during the measurement year as identified by the LTI flag in the Monthly Membership Detail Data File
- Members 66 years of age and older by the end of the measurement year with BOTH frailty and advanced illness criteria to be excluded:
 - Frailty: At least two indications of frailty with different dates of service during the measurement year. Do not include laboratory claims.
 - Advanced illness: Either of the following during the measurement period or the year prior to the measurement period:
 - · Advanced illness on at least two different dates of service
 - Dispensed dementia medication

Insights and recommendations

- Make sure to schedule diabetic eye exams each year
- Give members a list of eye care providers in their area
- Meet compliance with a retinal or dilated eye exam by an optometrist or ophthalmologist during
 measurement year or a negative exam by an eye care professional in the year prior to the measurement
 year
- Meet compliance by including a fundus photography in your medical record with results, date and signature of eye care professional
- Hypertensive retinopathy is considered the same as diabetic retinopathy
- Blindness is not an exclusion for a diabetic eye exam
- Consider closing this gap in care during a telehealth visit
- You can use eye exam results read by a system with artificial intelligence (AI)
- Automated eye exam (CPT code 92229) billed by any provider type during the measurement year meets compliance
