2025

Adolescents turning 13 years old during measurement year

COMMERCIAL | MEDICAID

Measure definition

Percentage of adolescents who have had the following by their 13th birthday:

- One dose of meningococcal vaccine between the 10th and 13th birthdays **or**
 - Anaphylaxis due to meningococcal vaccine anytime on or before member's 13th birthday
- One tetanus, diphtheria, toxoids and acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine between 10th and 13th birthdays **or**
 - Anaphylaxis due to tetanus, diphtheria or pertussis vaccine anytime on or before member's 13th birthday
 - Encephalitis due to tetanus, diphtheria or pertussis vaccine anytime on or before member's 13th birthday
- A human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine series completed between the member's 9th and 13th birthdays **or**
 - Anaphylaxis due to HPV vaccine anytime on or before member's 13th birthday
 - If HPV two dose schedule, there **must** be 146 days between the first and second dose



Medical record requirements

- Member legal name and date of birth
- Provider/practice identifier
- Provider Business Group (PBG) name and number
- Date of service (DOS)
- Applicable lab/test results and date collected



Commonly used claim codes*

(Not all-inclusive; can submit through electronic clinical data systems)

- Tdap vaccine procedure: **90715**
- Meningococcal vaccine procedure: **90734, 90733**
- HPV vaccine procedure: **90649, 90650, 90651**
- Anaphylaxis caused by diphtheria and tetanus vaccine: **SNOMED 428281000124107, 428291000124105**

Medical record submission methods may not be applicable to all plan types.

Required exclusions (Other exclusions may also apply)

- Members in hospice or using hospice services during measurement year
- Members who died during measurement year

Insights and recommendations

- **Do not** count meningococcal recombinant (serogroup B) (MenB) vaccines.
- Immunizations documented under a generic header and generic documentation “vaccine was administered” meet criteria (examples: “Tdap/Td” and “meningococcal”)
- Keep in mind that it’s **not** sufficient to note that the adolescent is “up to date” with immunizations
- Schedule follow-up vaccinations/doses at same time
- Maintain immunization flow chart for easy tracking
- Document dates and vaccines administered
- Use NCQA coding tips to actively reflect care rendered
- Contact parents to schedule their child’s vaccination appointments
- Educate parents on vaccines, their side effects and the importance of completing the HPV series
- Use already scheduled appointments as an opportunity to review immunization records and encourage opportunities to catch up on missing immunizations
- Provide handouts on the diseases the vaccines prevent
