Measure definition

Children who had the following number of well-child visits with a primary care physician (PCP) in measurement year. The following rates are reported:

- Children who turned 15 months old during measurement year: 6 or more well-child visits
- Children who turned 30 months old during measurement year: 2 or more well-child visits

The well-child visits must occur with a PCP, but the PCP doesn't have to be the practitioner assigned to child.



Medical record requirements

- Member legal name and date of birth
- Provider/practice identifier
- Provider Business Group (PBG) name and number
- Date of service (DOS)
- Applicable lab/test results and date collected

1 or more of the following codes per visit:

Required exclusions (Other exclusions may also apply)

- Members in hospice or using hospice services anytime during measurement year
- · Members who died anytime during measurement year

Insights and recommendations

- Schedule the appropriate number of well-child visits per child's age on different dates of service
 - Best practice is to schedule well visits at least 14 days apart to be counted as distinct visits
 - Schedule all needed upcoming well-child visits before child and parents leave your office
- Acute or chronic condition visits, inpatient visits and emergency department visits don't count toward gap closure
- Emphasize importance of completing all milestone visits, recognizing each child and family are unique
- Follow up on cancelled appointments
